Agnes Steinbach -- Kankakee Visitation for Agnes J. Steinbach, 93, of Kankakee, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Saturday at St. Martin of Tours Catholic Church, where she was a member. Rev. Dennis Settles will officiate. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais. Memorials may be made to the Alzheimer's Association or to the family wishes. She died Tuesday (Oct. 9, 2007) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. Mrs. Steinbach had been a nurse at St. Mary's Hospital for 25 years. She was born Oct. 9, 1914, the daughter of James and Beatrice Salek Cejka. Her husband, Edward J. Steinbach, whom she married Jan. 3, 1944, at Chanute Air Force Base in Rantoul, died July 8, 1983. She was a graduate of St. Anthony de Padua Hospital School of Nursing in Chicago. She served in the U.S. Army Air Corps Evacuation Unit for two years. She was a member of St. Mary's Alumni. She worked with the St. Mary's Hospital Volunteer Office, and was a volunteer for the American Red Cross Bloodmobile and Disaster Aid. Surviving are four sons and daughters-in-law, Michael John and Elaine Steinbach of Houston, Texas, David and Jeanne Steinbach of Frankfort, Matthew and Mary Kay Steinbach of Streamwood, Marc and Michealena Steinbach of Schaumburg; three daughters and one son-in-law, MaryLynne Cappelletti of Houston, Texas, Jo (Beatrice) and Jeffory Dick of Rolling Meadows, Teresa K. Choate of Bourbonnais; 22 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren; and one sister, Rose Frolik of DeKalb. Deceased are one granddaughter, Sarah Choate; two

brothers, Clarence and Francis Cejka; and one sister, Helen Long.
