Surviving are his wife, the former Ruth Cilley, whom he married June 29, 1974, in Glen Ellyn; three sons and one daughter-in-law, Brian and Betka Reynolds of Vienna, Austria, Chris Reynolds of Hermosa Beach, Calif., Matthew Reynolds of Bourbonnais; two sisters, Barb Jagers of Munroe Falls, Ohio, Janet Reynolds of Antioch; and one brother and sister-in-law, Glenn and Ginny Reynolds of Glen Ellyn.
