Allen Menard -- Doylestown, Pa. Allen H. Menard, 46, of Doylestown, Pa., formerly of Kankakee, died Tuesday (Nov. 7, 2006) in Doylestown. Visitation will be from 1 p.m. to 7 p.m. Sunday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, 1480 W. Court St., Kankakee. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Monday at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, 486 W. Merchant St., Kankakee. Rev. Charles Wheeler will officiate. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery, Bourbonnais, directly following the funeral Mass. Mr. Menard was CEO of Tranzonic Companies, Cleveland, Ohio. He was born June 15, 1960, in Kankakee, the son of Paul and Arletta Jones Menard. He received his MBA from Kellogg Business School-Northwestern University. He was a member of Calvary Chapel Church in Chalfont. He was a motorcycle enthusiast. Surviving are his wife, the former Diane Golding, whom he married Oct. 11, 1985, in Kankakee; four sons, Ryan at college at Penn State University, and Nicholas, Grant, and Reid, all of Doylestown; one daughter, Claire of Doylestown; his mother of Bourbonnais; sisters and brothers-in-law, Polly and Donald Lovasz, Mary and Michael Kohl,

Maria and Michael Dempsey, Ellen and Ronald Wetterling; brothers and sisters-in-law, Jamie and Joanie Menard, Michael and Linda Menard, David and Suzanne Menard, Timothy Menard, William Menard, Patrick and Rosa Menard, Warren and Lori Menard, Mark and Gina Menard, and Adam and Stacey Menard. 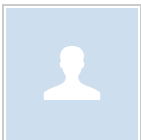
