“ Remembering my dear Aunt Anita. She and my Mom were very close in age, so many of the photos I am sharing in coming days naturally include both of them. I loved their doll and pet photos and many others as children in their childhood homes, together with their parents and loving cousins. They were in the Civil Air Patrol together, each got married early in life and raised their children.

Aunt Anita loved history, took great pride in her hometown of Kankakee, and all it had to offer. (She boasted of being born on the same street where her life culminated.) She loved to peruse all of the old local history books. I would not be doing her justice if I didnt share some of our memories of taking a walk in Bird Park, visiting the old homestead on May Avenue, trips to Dairy Queen, the Kankakee Museum, Carlos' for pork tenderloin sandwiches, and visiting the Kankakee train depot to which she donated a trunk her father used when working in the CCC Camps long ago.

She also took pride in having heritage with the Potawatomie Indians through her father's family. We would stop and visit the local stone landmark at the Kankakee Courthouse.

As a child, I would travel with my family on the long road trips to Kankakee every other summer until I grew older, started working, and the visits became less frequent. But what I especially loved about her then was her joy of journaling and correspondence. Writing letters back and forth was fun. We would save up and send each other cartoons or anecdotes, photos, inspiring quotes - all of which brought joy to us both. In this age of emails and texts, that writing has become an art form. I will miss that but I have many to reopen and enjoy always.

Aunt Anita and I also share a love of animals, both having pets throughout our lives. She would even pray with them. They were her joy especially later in life.

Aunt Anita lived a full life raising a son, working very hard, enjoying

life, and ultimately caring for her ill family members. No one knows how their lives will end. She struggled at the very end but she was ready, prayed for, and was at peace to go home to our Lord's loving arms. She is at glorious rest!

Love you. Aunt Anita. You know that. And, I know you are ecstatic to get back together with Mom, Aunt Aud, Uncle Bud, Uncle Nick (the Musketeers) and the rest. I am so grateful that you had the chance to meet my husband, Mario, in our earlier days. Rest well until we all meet again. Xo 🙏❤️🐾🐕🐶🐾🐾

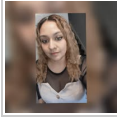

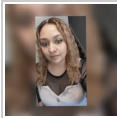
