



Anna Janevicius

December 22, 1925 - January 3, 2024

Anna Janevicius, age 98, of Kankakee, passed away on January 3rd, 2024. She was born on December 22nd, 1925, in Kupiškis, Lithuania, to Jonas Balčiūnas and Anėlė Palileika.

Shortly after she graduated high school in June, 1944, Anna escaped the communist invasion of Lithuania and moved to Germany where she lived during and after World War II. She completed nursing school in Regensburg, Germany, then immigrated to the United States in 1949.

Anna married Vincas Janevicius on January 6th, 1953, in Chicago, where they subsequently became United States citizens. He preceded her in death on November 18th, 2011. Anna worked as a nurse at Englewood Hospital in Chicago before she had children, after which she devoted her time to caring for her family. She enjoyed needlepoint, spending time with friends, shopping at Dollar Stores, and her daily dinners at Ryan's Pier in Aroma Park. She lived in her home for 52 years.

Anna is survived by her two sons, Raymond Janevicius of Oak Brook, IL, and Richard (Ellen) Janevicius of Kailua Kona, HI; 2 grandchildren, Michelle Janevicius of Paris, France, and Marshall Janevicius of Arlington, VA; and several nephews in Lithuania.

Anna is preceded in death by her parents, her husband, and her one sister Valé Stanys.

Visitation will be held at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home in Kankakee on Saturday, January 13, 2024 from 9 a.m. until the time of the funeral service at 10:30 a.m.

Burial will follow at Kankakee Memorial Gardens immediately following the funeral.
