Antoinette M. Benoit, 100, of Bourbonnais, died Friday (April 14, 2006) at Prairieview Lutheran Home in Danforth. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. She was a member of St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, St. Anne Sodality, Women of the Moose for 30 years, Womens Auxiliary of the Kankakee American Legion and a retired teacher. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Edwin and Gwen Benoit of Loda, Zephyr and Joan Benoit of Bourbonnais; one daughter, Monica Ruder of Herscher; 27 grandchildren; 70 great-grandchildren; and 29 great-great-grandchildren. One infant son, Francis; two other sons, Louie George and Leandra; two grandchildren; and two brothers, Aphram and Adrien, are deceased.
