



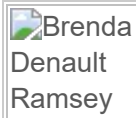
## Armel Denault

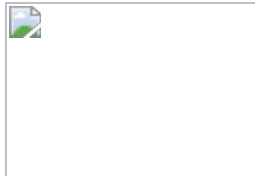

flip off that board and fly. How you loved the water, I remember

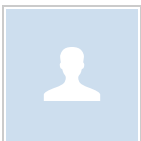
