Arthur Voigt -- Grant Park Arthur "Art" F. Voigt, 91, of Grant Park, died Thursday (Sept. 28, 2006) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee. Visitation will be from 9 a.m. Saturday until the 11 a.m. services at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. Rev. Byron Miller will officiate. Mr. Voigt was a farmer until 1956 and then a self-employed carpenter. He was born March 24, 1915, in Bonfield, the son of Edward W. and Esther O. Stroud Voigt. Surviving are his wife, the former Cleo Kirchner, whom he married Sept. 19, 1936, in Bonfield; three sons and daughters-in-law, Orland and Lorraine Voigt, Harold and Shirley Voigt, all of Grant Park, Melvin and Sally Voigt of Momence; nine grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild; one brother, Stanley Voigt of Bonfield; one sister-in-law, Dorothy Voigt of Bonfield; and several nieces and nephews. Deceased are three brothers and two sisters-in-law, Walter Voigt, Leonard and Vera Voigt, Clarence Voigt, and Lila Voigt.

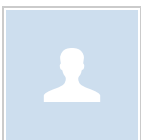
