Audrey "Mort" Regnier, 76, of Morocco, Ind., formerly of Beaverville, died Sunday (Feb. 19, 2006) at his home. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Houk Funeral Home, St. Anne, and from 9 a.m. Wednesday at St. Mary's Catholic Church, Beaverville, until the 10 a.m. celebration of the funeral Mass.
