A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Friday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church in Bourbonnais. Father Richard Pighini will officiate. Burial will be in St. James Cemetery in Irwin. She died Tuesday (Aug. 11, 2009) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, following a short illness. Mrs. Merten was a bookkeeper in the grocery business, retiring in 1984; and also retired in 2006 from Chamness & Merten Accounting. She was born June 1, 1923, in Irwin, the daughter of Daniel and Ella Knittel O'Connor. Her husband, Francis J. Merten, whom she married May 16, 1942, at St. James Church in Irwin, died March 6, 1967.
