



## Ben Caffee Jr.

December 23, 1921 - January 19, 2010

Visitation for Ben Caffee Jr., 88, of Kankakee, will be from 9 a.m. Saturday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, until the procession to St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church for a 10:30 a.m. funeral Mass. Burial will be held at 10 a.m. Monday at Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery, Elwood. Memorials may be made for Masses or to the family wishes. He died Tuesday (Jan. 19, 2010) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. Mr. Caffee was a retired supervisor in quality control from Roper Corp., Kankakee Division, after 42 years. He was born Dec. 23, 1921, in Marseilles, the son of Ben Sr. and Sarah Wilson Caffee. He was the former union president at Roper and had also been assistant superintendent of Kankakee Public Works. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II in the Pacific Theater, earning the Purple Heart and three Bronze Stars. He was a member of the Moose Lodge, Roper Keyman Club and the Kankakee American Legion Post 85. Surviving are his wife, the former Eileen Crawley, whom he married Dec. 8, 1945, at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church in Kankakee; one daughter, Sondra "Sandy" Cromwell of Kankakee; one grandson, Eric (Christin) Beach of Bradley; and one great-granddaughter, Sydney. Deceased are his parents, three brothers and five sisters.
