Bernard Schore -- Bourbonnais Bernard Schore, 82, of Bourbonnais, died Saturday (April 28, 2007) at the Illinois Veterans Home at Manteno. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Wednesday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery. Memorials may be made to Hospice of Kankakee Valley, the Illinois Veterans Home at Manteno, or to the family wishes. Mr. Schore was a truck driver for Rogers Cartage, retiring after 34 years of service. He was a former Bourbonnais police chief and one of the original members of the Bourbonnais Park Board. He was born June 7, 1924, in Morocco, Ind., the son of Benjamin J. and Luella Lemming Schore. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II in the South Pacific and was a member of the Bradley VFW Post 6502 and the Bradley American Legion Post 0766. He was a member of Maternity BVM Catholic Church, the Holy Name Society, and a former usher. He was also a member of Teamsters Local 179 Retirees Club, the Moose Lodge, St. Mary's Seniors Club, Riverside Seniors Club, and the Bradley, Bourbonnais, St. George Senior Citizens. He was a former member of the Elks Club in Mission, Texas, and the Knights of Columbus. He enjoyed camping, boating, playing cards, and visiting with his friends and family. Surviving are his wife, the former Marie Peterson, whom he married Sept. 5, 1953, in Chicago; one son and daughter-in-law, Paul and Mary Schore of Bourbonnais; one daughter and son-in-law, Jeanne and Frank Barber of St. Anne; six grandchildren, Beth and

Joey Shelton, Mark Schore, Matthew Schore, and Monica, Josh, and Jacob Barber; and many nieces and nephews. Deceased are his parents; father-in-law and mother-in-law, Anthon and Agnes Peterson; three sisters, Loveatta St. Peter, Vera Plasters, Annabelle Sluis; one brother, Herman Schore; and one grandson, Nathan Barber.
