June 27, 1934 - December 8, 2022

Bernice Bukosky (88) of Kankakee passed peacefully on December 8, 2022 after a prolonged illness. Ms. Bukosky was a long-time faculty member in the English Department at Kankakee Community College. She was a native of Donora, Pa. A graduate of Donora High School, she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in English from California University of Pennsylvania (California State Teachers College) and her Master of Arts in English from West Virginia University.

During her many years of living in Kankakee, Ms. Bukosky was an avid fan of the Chicago Bears football team, and an ardent admirer of legendary Bears Head Coach Mike Ditka.

Ms. Bukosky is survived by her life partner of more than 40 years, Mr. Gene Seamark of Kankakee, his mother Cecilia Seamark also of Kankakee, nephew Ronald Anthony (Elaine Anthony) of Irwin, PA, nephew Gerard Hilinski (Charlotte Wasko) of Brunswick, OH and great nephews Brad Anthony, Robert Anthony, Brian Hilinski, great niece Elizabeth Holtzman and their respective spouses and children. In addition, she has numerous cousins residing throughout the mid-Atlantic region of the United States.

Ms. Bukosky was preceded in death by father Val Bukosky, mother Rose Bukosky, sister Ethel Anthony and sister Cecilia Hilinski.
