She was born Nov. 14, 1920, on a farm in Sumner Township, the daughter of Louis and Victoria Langlois Soucie. Her husband, John T. Moran, whom she married Feb. 5, 1944, in San Francisco, Calif., died Sept. 20, 1972. She served in the Women Marines during World War II. She was a volunteer for the American Red Cross, Provena St. Mary's Hospital, and Good Shepherd Manor. She was a member of the CCW at her church. Surviving are one son, John M. Moran of Middleton, N.H.; two grandchildren, Jack H. (Stephanie) Moran, and Natalie B. Moran; and several nieces and nephews, including Sharon Soucie Jackson of Kankakee, Mickey Soucie Kreissler of Clifton, and Raoul (Diane) Soucie of South Bend, Ind. Deceased are three brothers, Armand, Raymond and Edmund.
