She died Tuesday (Sept. 20, 2005) at Manor Care Health Services of Kankakee, where she had been a resident for the past seven years. Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Fual Home, West Kankakee, is in charge of arrangements. Mrs. Hayslip retired in 1972 from the State of Illinois in psychiatric nursing as an aide 3. She had also worked at Florence Stove Co. and had her own beauty shop with her sister Olive. She was born May 5, 1907, in Kankakee, the daughter of Charles A. and Cora Hertz. Her first husband, Edwin Samuel Swan, whom she married in 1928, died due to an accident in 1932. She then married Vernon Lester Cheffer in 1938. He died due to an accident in 1956. She later married Glen Hayslip in 1987. He died Sept. 12, 2002. She was active in church work for at least 53 years in at least five churches doing such things as being a pastor's wife, teaching Sunday school, superintending the church Cradle Roll and participating in Bible Study groups. Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Franklin and Lynn Swan of Paw Paw, Vernon Jr. and Felicia Cheffer of Memphis, Tenn.; one son-in-law, Duane Piper of Venice, Fla.; three stepdaughters, Jeane Ward of Kankakee, Mae Keath of Weslaco, Texas, Marcia Lucky of Marietta, Ga.; two sisters,

Helen Werner of Paxton, Olive Ford of Michigan City, Ind.; many grandchildren, great-grandchildren and great-great-grandchildren.

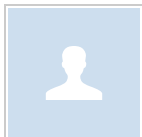
