Betty Maass -- Kankakee Betty R. Maass, 83, of Kankakee, died Saturday (July 12, 2008) at the Illinois Veterans Home at Manteno. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, where services will be held at 11 a.m. Wednesday. The Rev. Barbara Lohrbach will officiate. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens, Aroma Township. Memorials may be made to the Alzheimer's Association or to Hospice of Kankakee Valley. Mrs. Maass was retired from the Kankakee state's attorney's office. She was born Dec. 2, 1924, in Kankakee, the daughter of Raymond and Marie Spence Jannusch. She was a veteran of the U.S. Navy Waves, serving during World War II, and a member of Kankakee American Legion Post 85. She had been a volunteer at Provena St. Mary's Hospital. She was a former member of St. John's United Church of Christ. She was an avid Cubs fan and enjoyed traveling and working jigsaw puzzles and crossword puzzles. Surviving are her husband, Rodney Maass, of Kankakee, whom she married April 2, 1949, in Kankakee; two daughters and one son-in-law, Teresa and Jeffrey Campbell of Las Cruces, N.M., Elizabeth "Lisa" Maass of Evanston; three grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; and one sister and brother-in-law, Mary and Thomas Maass of Kankakee.
