Carol A. Hunger, 68, of St. Anne, passed away Thursday (May 8, 2014) at Presence St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee, on their 49th wedding anniversary. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Kankakee. Burial will be in the Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery in Elwood. Memorials may be made to the family wishes.
