Clarence Habedank -- Kankakee Clarence H. Habedank, 87, of Kankakee, died Friday (Sept. 22, 2006), at his residence. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, and from 9 a.m. Tuesday at St. Paul's Lutheran Church until the 10 a.m. funeral services.
