November 13, 1951 - July 19, 2025

Clifford W. Smith III, age 73, of Bourbonnais, passed away peacefully in his home Saturday, July 19th, 2025. He was born November 13th, 1951 in Chicago, son of Dr. Clifford & Shirley Jean Smith. Cliff married Clodagh Marie Casey at St. Irenaeus Catholic Church in Park Forest, IL on March 5th, 1988.

Survived by his wife of 37 years, Clodagh Smith of Bourbonnais; daughter, Bridget & husband Alex DeWees; son, Clifford Smith IV & granddaughter Aurora Smith; one brother, Michael Smith & family of Florida; mother-in-law, Bridie Casey of Ireland; brothers-in-laws and sister-in-law, Niall Casey & family of Ireland, Grainne Casey & family of NY, and Dhara Casey & family of Ireland; and nephews and niece. Cliff is preceded in death by his parents.

Cliff earned both his undergraduate and master's degrees from Bradley University in Peoria, IL, and pursued continuing education at VanderCook College of Music in Chicago, IL.

Cliff was the band director for St. Anne Grade School for 27 years and also taught private lessons every week at King Music for 30+ years. Cliff dedicated his life to not only teaching music but playing the trumpet. He was a member of the Kankakee Municipal Band, The Swing Kings, River Valley Wind Ensemble, Kings of Dixieland, and the Jazz Time Big Band. Cliff enjoyed golfing, playing crossword and solitaire on his phone, and loved history.

Cliff attended & from time to time played music for Maternity B.V.M. Catholic Church of Bourbonnais.

Visitation will be held from 3-8 p.m. on Friday, July 25th, 2025 at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be held at 11 a.m. on Saturday, July 26th, 2025 at Maternity B.V.M. Catholic Church in Bourbonnais. Rev. Father Jason Nesbit will officiate the Mass. Cremation rites will be accorded following the Mass.

Last time I saw Cliff and Clodagh was about 8 years go — but Cliff and I would talk on the phone and try to catch up. I’ll miss those two hour+ conversations.
