



Curt VadeBonCoeur

Visitation for Curt M. VadeBonCoeur, 44, originally from Kankakee, will be from 3:30-8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee, where services will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday. Mr. VadeBonCoeur died Monday (Jan. 24, 2005) in Crescent City, Calif. He was born July 8, 1960 in Urbana, the son of Bill and Eileen Hebert VadeBonCoeur. Surviving are his parents; and one brother and sister-in-law, Glenn and Donna VadeBonCoeur of Winfield. Mr. VadeBonCoeur graduated from Kankakee Eastridge High School in 1978, the University of Illinois, Champaign, and the Federal Law Enforcement Center in Glyneo, Ga. He had a distinguished career as a National Park Service Law Enforcement Ranger. He served in various parks across the United States, most recently at Redwood National Park in California. During his career, he led forest fire fighting crews and was a certified DARE instructor. He participated in multiple, successful searches and rescues.
