



Dale Pallissard

December 15, 1934 - December 24, 2004

Visitation for Dale Pallissard, 70, of Bourbonnais, will be from 4-8 p.m. Wednesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Thursday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais, where he was a member for 41 years. Rev. George Auger and Deacon Mush Marcotte will officiate. Burial will be in Maternity Cemetery, Bourbonnais. Memorials may be made for Masses or to the family wishes. He died Friday (Dec. 24, 2004) at his home. Mr. Pallissard farmed all his life in Bourbonnais and Manteno Townships. He was born Dec. 15, 1934, in Kankakee, the son of Paul and Lenore Duby Pallissard. His father is deceased. Surviving are his wife, the former Katherine Sadie, of Bourbonnais, whom he married June 22, 1963, at Maternity BVM Catholic Church; three sons and two daughters-in-law, Dale Paul and Melissa Pallissard of Watseka, Joel and Beth Pallissard of Frankfort, Andy Pallissard of Manteno; his mother of Bourbonnais; one sister and brother-in-law, Lois and Max Grinstead of Bourbonnais; two brothers and sisters-in-law, Herbert and Cindy Pallissard, Donald and Mary Lou Pallissard, all of Bourbonnais; and two grandchildren. Two brothers, Bernard and Wayne Pallissard; and one sister, Doris Bowels, are deceased. Mr. Pallissard joined the U.S. Army in 1955 attaining the rank of sergeant. He attended NCO Academy in July 1955. He taught ROTC and was in the heavy artillery division, serving in Yakima, Wash., Indian Reservation. Soldiers were loaded on ships in the Pacific and taken to California. They then went to Ft. Watchuka, Ariz. to experiment with

atomic warheads on 155 howitzers. He was discharged Dec. 31, 1956 and honorably discharged Dec. 31, 1962. He was a member of the Kankakee Farm Bureau and was a Director for 18 years. He was serving his second term on the Kankakee County Farmland Assessment Review as Commissioner. Mr. Pallissard was a member of the Moose and the National Cattlemen's Association. He loved farming and raising cattle.
