David Walton -- Kankakee David G. Walton, 68, of Kankakee, died Monday (Sept. 24, 2007) at his home. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Wednesday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, where services will be held at 10:30 a.m. Thursday. Rev. Rick Selk will officiate. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens, Aroma Township. Memorials may be made to the organ donation program of cancer research. Mr. Walton began working in the late 1950's and had worked at Kroehler Manufacturing, Montgomery Ward, Home Appliance and Heating, and Bennett Industries. He retired in the late 1990's from Commonwealth Edison, and after retirement, he drove for River Valley Metro and Heritage FS. He was born April 16, 1939, in Carroll, Tenn., the son of Martin and Oltha Faye Whitehead Walton. He served in the U.S. Army Reserves. He loved gardening, mechanical work and fixing anything he could get his hands on. Surviving are his wife, the former Nesha Gropp, whom he married Aug. 24, 1957, at Zion Lutheran Church, Chebanse; three sons and daughters-in-law, Lyndon and Barb Walton of Bourbonnais, Kevin and Vikki Walton of Belleplaine, Minn., Robert and Mary Walton of Aurora; two daughters and one son-in-law, Andrea and Tim Krizan of Kankakee, Amy Stiner of London, England; seven grandchildren; three sisters, Becky Burton and Betty Wilkes, both of Tennessee, Joyce Walton of Simpson; one brother, Tim Walton of Tennessee; and several nieces and nephews. Deceased are his parents; two sisters, Mildred James and Sylvia McGranahan; and three infant brothers.
