David A. "Dave" Wonder, age 43, of Bourbonnais passed away Tuesday, November 4, 2025. He was born January 12, 1982 in Bloomington, IN, the son of Kenneth & Marta (Howard) Wonder. Dave married Lisa Brinkmann on May 29, 2004 at Zion Lutheran Church in Beecher.

Dave loved the Lord. He lived his life according to Romans 12:1-2, "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Dave truly enjoyed spending time with his family-playing sports, being outdoors, and watching the kids' sporting events. He was so full of joy, overflowing from his love of Jesus, it was obvious to all he encountered.
