



Dennis Paul Bergeron

September 2, 1949 - April 15, 2020

Dennis Paul Bergeron, 70, passed away on April 15, 2020 at the Palomar Medical Center, Escondido, California, following a lengthy illness. Dennis was born on September 2, 1949 in Kankakee, Illinois, the second youngest of seven children, to Clarence and Violet Bergeron.

He graduated from Marmion Military Academy, Aurora, Illinois in 1967, and then attended the University of St. Thomas in Saint Paul, MN. After college, Dennis returned to Kankakee to work in the family automotive business, Bergeron Pontiac. In June 1973 he married Joan Vallee.
