Dennis Pepin -- Chicago Visitation for Dennis "Dene" Pepin, 54, of Chicago, formerly of Manteno, will be from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Wednesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Manteno. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 1 p.m. Thursday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, Bourbonnais. Rev. Richard Pighini will officiate. Burial will be in St. Joseph Cemetery, Manteno. Memorials may be made to the family wishes. He died Friday (Jan. 26, 2007) at his home. Mr. Pepin was a freelance hair and make up artist for print, packaging, posters, ads and TV commercials. He was director of student education curriculum at Pivot Point International School of Cosmetology. He was born Sept. 6, 1952, in Kankakee, the son of Elmer and Irma Binder Pepin. He was a graduate of St. Joseph Catholic School, Manteno; Manteno High School; Broadway School of Cosmetology; and the Pivot Point International School of Cosmetology. He was also a graduate of the Art Institute of Chicago and the Academy of Fine Arts. He was a member of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic Church, Chicago. Surviving are his mother of Manteno; two brothers and one sister-in-law, Karlan and Beth Pepin of Manteno, David Pepin of Grant Park; and nieces and nephews. Deceased are his father, Deacon Elmer Pepin (1995) and one nephew, Anthony Pepin.
