



## Donald Jenkins

July 8, 1923 - November 8, 2008

Donald A. "Don" Jenkins, 85, of Bourbonnais, died Saturday (Nov. 8, 2008) at Riverside Medical Center, Kankakee. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, and from 10 a.m. Tuesday at the Bradley Evangelical United Methodist Church, until the 11 a.m. services. The Rev. Jim Williams will officiate. Burial will be in Mound Grove Gardens. Memorials may be made to the Bradley Evangelical United Methodist Church. Mr. Jenkins retired from Roper's in 1988, where he had worked in the warehouse. He had also been a self-employed barber. He had worked as a barber at Hotel Kankakee. He was born July 8, 1923, in Papineau, the son of Arthur and Sophie Strouve Jenkins. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army serving during World War II. He was a member of Bradley Evangelical United Methodist Church, where he had been a head usher and on the church bowling team. He delivered Meals on Wheels for 18 years and a member of the Prime Timers. He enjoyed fishing, gardening and working in the yard. He was an avid lifelong White Sox fan. Surviving are his wife, the former Lois Ellen Hertz, whom he married Oct. 11, 1947, at Grand Prairie United Methodist Church, Bonfield; three daughters and sons-in-law, Karen and Carl Waltenbaugh of Oak Park, Donna and Jack Metz of Momence, Patricia and Gary Umphrey of Heyworth; 11 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. Deceased are two brothers, William Jenkins, and his twin, Ronald Jenkins.
