Donald O'Connor -- Irwin Visitation for Donald M. O'Connor, 93, of Irwin, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday at Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Saturday at St. James Catholic Church in Irwin. Rev. Ronald Hart will officiate. Burial will be in St. James Cemetery, Irwin. Memorials may be made to the family wishes or for Masses. He died Tuesday (Sept. 25, 2007) at Riverside Medical Center, Kankakee. Mr. O'Connor was an Irwin area farmer and sold DeKalb Seed Corn from 1940-2006. He was also the mayor of Irwin from 1969-2005. He was born Dec. 21, 1913, in rural Irwin, the son of Maurice and Anna Berns O'Connor. He was a 1930 graduate of St. Patrick High School and was a musician in several area bands. He was a member of St. James Catholic Church in Irwin, where he was a member of the Holy Name Society. He was a trustee on the village board in 1945, an auditor on the Otto Township board from 1959-2001 and a member of the St. James Cemetery board since 1979. He was an Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) committeeman, a member of the Farm Bureau, Knights of Columbus, Regional Planning Commission and the Irwin Lions Club. Surviving are his wife, the former Mary Anne Sullivan, whom he married Dec. 29, 1937, at St. James Catholic Church in Irwin; four sons and three daughters-in-law, Tom R. O'Connor, Gene O'Connor, Dave and Martha O'Connor, and Pat and Rose O'Connor, all of Irwin, Theresa O'Connor of Kankakee; three daughters and two sons-in-law, Maureen and Tom L. O'Connor of Bourbonnais, Virginia and Leonell Fritz of St. Charles, Kathy

O'Connor of Irwin; 17 grandchildren, 26 great-grandchildren and four great-great-grandchildren; two sisters, Ruby Hillary of Kankakee, Louise Borschnack of Irwin; and two brothers -in-law, Gene (Collette) Sullivan of St. Anne, and Tom Sullivan of Kankakee. Deceased are one son, Donald; one great-grandson, Joseph Barrett; and two sisters, Myrtle Ninis and Marie Murphy.
