



## Donald Wesoloski

December 15, 1934 - April 17, 2009

Donald Francis Wesoloski, 74, of Kankakee, died Friday (April 17, 2009) at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, following a short illness. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. today at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick Catholic Church, where he was a member. The Rev. John Peeters will officiate. Burial will be in Mount Olivet Cemetery, Wilmington. Memorials may be made to St. Patrick Catholic Church or to the donor's choice. Mr. Wesoloski had been a chemist at Armour Pharmaceutical for 40 years, retiring in 2000. He was born Dec. 15, 1934, in Joliet, the son of Frank and Elizabeth Cooper Wesoloski. He was a 1952 graduate of Wilmington High School and a 1959 graduate of the University of Illinois. He was involved in 4-H in Will County when he was growing up. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1955-1957. He was a volunteer at Provena St. Mary's Hospital and was a 3rd degree member of the Knights of Columbus. He was active in the lives of his grandchildren. Surviving are his wife, the former Judy Olivetti, of Kankakee, whom he married Aug. 25, 1962, at St. Rose Catholic Church in Wilmington; two sons and daughters-in-law, Daniel and Brenda Wesoloski of Bourbonnais, Gary and Karen Wesoloski of Naperville; one daughter and son-in-law, Karen and Mark Olszewski of Cincinnati, Ohio; seven grandchildren, Amber and Kyle Wesoloski, Kathryn, Madelyn and Lauryn Wesoloski, Matthew and Jackson Olszewski; one sister and brother-in-law, Virginia and Donald Johnson of Hertford, N.C.; one sister-in-law, Josephine Sorensen of Manteno; one
