



## Doris Nusbaum

September 4, 1935 - March 12, 2009

Visitation for Doris E. Nusbaum, 73, of Bourbonnais, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, where services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday. The Rev. Kathy Sweet will officiate. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens, Aroma Township. In lieu of flowers, donations can be made to a future park for children, created in memory of Doris. She died Thursday (March 12, 2009) at Riverside Medical Center, after a long illness. Ms. Nusbaum retired in June of 1992 from Bradley School District 61, where she taught her whole career of 35 years. Along with her duties as physical education teacher, she also coached intramurals, cheerleading for 25 years, girls' track and volleyball. She was born Sept. 4, 1935, in Kankakee, the daughter of Donald and Florabelle Dyon Nusbaum. She was a graduate of Kankakee High School and received her bachelor's and master's degrees from Illinois State University. Ms. Nusbaum was a life member of the National Education Association, the Illinois Education Association, an honorary member of Delta Kappa Gamma, and a member of UCT (United Commercial Travelers). Surviving are one brother and sister-in-law, Donald and Nancy Nusbaum; one aunt, Mabel Alberts; one uncle, Ambrose (wife, Cleva) Dyon; cousins, Bill Dyon, Jim, Jerry, June and Tom (wife, Beverly) Alberts, LaVerne E. Dyon, Paulette J. (husband, Douglas) Hambley, and Buzz R. Dyon, along with many nieces and nephews and great-nieces and great-nephews; and special friend, Sandra R. Davis. Deceased are her parents, and several nieces and nephews.
