“What memories we, in the McNulty family, have of Doris and Bud who would come to visit all the time in the 50s. And all the funny conversations Dori and I had over they years. Our last visit was at Dave Stone's wake. We laugh a lot there.

Bud was literally my dad's best friend in high school. They played in the Downbeats together. Earl was always fun and did so much work for my folks at the house including pouring their porches. Bud could do anything. When he was pouring the font port at mom's he told me to go find some old junk around the lot we'd trough it in to take up some space. We toss in an old broken bike and both had a laugh about that. I was 8. When he fixed or made something it lasted for every. There is not one crack in the porch he poured in 1957. He did some work in my house too and it's perfect.

Doris and Earl came to the Homestead in Kankakee in the early 2000s, when my big band played there before the restaurant closed. They both enjoy the music of their era so much and Dori told me many funny stories. Bud was a good player. He played sax. My dad and Buddy went to Kankakee High for the first 2 years and then my grandmother decided to send my dad to St. Pat's. Dad told Earl he was going to change school, and Earl responded, "Well, I guess I'll go there, too." The were inseparable.

Doris helped me with a few books including stories of her time living at St.Patrick's Academy as a border. There was never a boring conversation with Doris. When I visited Doris and Earl, I'd have a a conversation with Doris and also with Earl --- through Doris. I'd ask Earl a question and Doris would answer and he would smile. They both told me stories of the 40s and added to my understanding of the time. My folks and Bud and Doris had some fun times together.

We always said the Earl and Doris were family and we all felt that way and never thought any different about it. Doris would baby sit us kids a lot in the 50s when ma was either having a baby or getting her back fixed. All the Uribe kids were fun too. We had fun when our

folks visited. I miss Bud and now I'll be missing Doris, too. God Bless.
