



## Dr. Gabriel Rose

Dr. Gabriel Rose, 97, of Kankakee, died Thursday (Feb. 3, 2005). Private funeral services were held Feb. 6 in Orlando, Fla. Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, is in charge of local arrangements. Dr. Rose was an eye, ear, nose and throat doctor in Kankakee for more than 50 years. One of his major concerns was industrial injuries of the eye. While a resident here, he also helped found and build the B'nai Israel Temple in Kankakee. He practiced medicine until retiring in 1979 at the age of 72, and he and his wife retired to Altamonte Springs, Fla. Shortly after her death in 1996, he returned to Kankakee. He was born in 1907, in Poland. He emigrated to America at the age of 7, growing up in Kankakee and attending Kankakee High School, where he was on the track and wrestling teams. He attended the University of Illinois Medical School in Chicago, where he married the former Edith Friedman in 1934. Surviving are one son, Bernard Rose of New York, N.Y.; one daughter, Dorothy Rose Gonson of Cambridge, Mass.; three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Dr. Rose served in the U.S. Air Force in the Pacific as a doctor during World War II from 1942-45, at the rank of captain. He loved gardening and classical music.
