Fillman, whom he married July 6, 1963, in Mattoon; one daughter and son-in-law, Kristie Marie and Bruce Stone, of Bradley; two grandchildren, Aaron and Destiny; one sister-in-law and brother-in-law, Fred and Sherry Fillman, of Mattoon; one niece, Kacy Fillman; and two nephews, Joshua Fillman and Zachary Hebert.
