"Dot" Wright, whom he married Dec. 26, 1942, in Little Rock, Ark., died Jan. 31, 2006. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II and earned a Silver Star, Good Conduct Medal, two Purple Heart Medals and a Victory Medal. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Kankakee, where he was an elder. He was a member of the Elk's Lodge and enjoyed golfing and yard work. Surviving are one son and daughter-in-law, Terrell "Terry" and RuthAnn Brown of Phoenix, Ariz.; one daughter, Diana Brown of Roselle; four grandchildren and one great-grandson; and one sister-in-law, Ima Brown of Gorman. One brother, J.W. "Dub" Brown, is deceased.
