February 27, 1917 - January 20, 2005

Eleanor I. Denoyer, 87, of Kankakee, died Thursday evening (Jan. 20, 2005) at ManorCare Health Services. She was born Feb. 27, 1917, in Streator, the daughter of Henry and Jane Piercy Moore. She was raised by her mother and stepfather, Dr. William Cohan, now deceased, in Chicago Heights, where she graduated from Bloom Township High School. In 1935 she married John Henry Henneike in St. Anne. He died in 1969. She is survived by her husband, Sherman Denoyer, whom she married May 12, 1973, in St. Anne.
