Visitation for Emilie Ziebart, 84, of Kankakee, will be from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Wednesday, with recitation of the rosary at 7 p.m., at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 9:30 a.m. Thursday at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, Kankakee.

She was preceded in death by her parents; one daughter, Berta Yonke; and one brother.
