Eva A. Wischnowski, 84, passed away Thursday (July 20, 2017) in Hospice at Riverside Medical Center in Kankakee.

She was born March 31, 1933 in Kankakee, the son of John and Eva Spangler Allie. She was the youngest of twelve children, all deceased, including her brothers Clarence, Kenneth, Jack, Robert, Raymond, Gerald, Gene, and Herbert Allie, and sister, Martha Turner. Infant twins, Gerald and Geraldine, also preceded her in death.

A graduate of the St. Mary's School of Nursing in Kankakee, Eva worked for 35 years at St. Mary's Hospital as a registered nurse and supervisor. In addition to caring for others, her joys were her family, friends, dancing, movies, and Christmas. She was the very first Homecoming Queen (1951) at St. Patrick's High School in Kankakee. In her role as mother, grandmother, nurse, and friend, she always put others first.

Surviving are five sons: Mike (Barbara) of Canandaigua, NY; Kevin (Beth) of Bourbonnais; Stan (Shawn) of Doylestown, PA; Bill (Cathy) of Indianapolis, IN; Tom (Lauren) of Trevor, WI; and one daughter, Brenda (Brian) McLaren of Bradley. She had 13 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. Eva had many special friends, too many to mention, whom she loved very much.

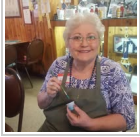

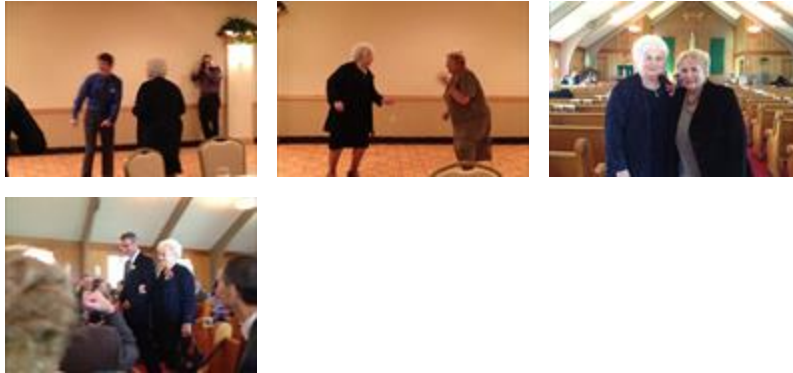

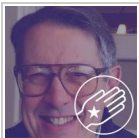
