Ferdinand Miller, retired cattle and grain farmer Limestone Twp. -- Ferdinand L. "Ferd" Miller, 90, of Limestone Township, went to meet the Lord Wednesday (Jan. 19, 2005). He died at the Miller Center in Kankakee. Visitation will be from 4-7 p.m. today and from 10 a.m. Saturday until the 11 a.m. services at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee. Rev. John Cross will officiate. Cremation rites will be accorded by the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Crematory, West Kankakee. Private interment services will be held at a later date. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to Hospice of Kankakee Valley. Mr. Miller, with his two brothers, Walter and Maurice, farmed all their lives on the family farm. They had dairy cattle, feeder cattle and pigs. They also raised grain. Ferd helped his brothers dig graves by hand at the Limestone Township Cemetery, where they were caretakers for over 50 years. He was born Oct. 1, 1914, on the family farm, the son of George and Ida Meyer Miller. He was one of 13 children. Surviving are three sisters, Pearle Peterson and Grace Ohrt, both of Limestone, Ruth DuBois of Springfield, Mo.; and many nieces and nephews. His parents; four brothers, Maurice, George, Walter and Clyde; and five sisters, Marjorie Hengl, Ida Marie Shelby, Arlene Ohrt, Alice Jordan and Goldie Stone, are deceased. He was a graduate of Mapes School in Limestone Township. Mr. Miller was a member of the Pure Milk Association and sold seed corn for PAG Seeds for 25 years.
