Visitation for Floyd Lester Salzman, 87, of Kankakee, will be from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Thursday at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee, where services will be held at 11 a.m. Friday. Deacon Joe Cotugno will officiate. Burial will be in Mound Grove Gardens. He died Thursday (Dec. 20, 2007) at the VA Illiana Health Care in Danville. Mr. Salzman was a lifelong farmer. He had worked for 30 years for Goodwill Industries and was a carpenter. He raised chickens for Hendrix Hatchery and Loomis Hatchery, and sold Pioneer Seed Corn. He was born June 2, 1920, in Limestone Township, the son of Charles and Amelia Seedorf Salzman. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army from 1941 to 1945. He enjoyed woodworking, traveling, reading and watching westerns, building birdhouses, working around the house and his pickup truck. Surviving are his wife, the former Mae Louise Bartschenfeld, whom he married Dec. 25, 1945, at Trinity United Methodist Church; two sons and daughters-in-law, Steven and Margot Salzman of Aiken, S.C., Tom and Karen Salzman of Windsor, Colo.; one daughter and son-in-law, Nancy and Rick Oster of Kankakee; four grandchildren, two stepgrandchildren, and two stepgreat-grandchildren; and many nieces and nephews. Deceased are one infant son, Terry Lee; three brothers, Harold, Clarence, and Willard; and two sisters, Ruth Milke and Esther Salzman.
