Visitation for Francis J. Goselin, 89, of Bourbonnais, will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Tuesday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church. Father Richard Pighini will officiate.

Burial will be in Mount Calvary Cemetery, Kankakee. Memorials may be made to Hospice of Kankakee Valley. He died Sunday (April 17, 2011) at his home.

Mr. Goselin retired from Roper Corp., Bradley Division, after 43 years of service. He was also employed by the Bourbonnais Elementary School District 53. He was born Aug. 19, 1921, in Irwin, the son of George Sr. and Margaret Jakob Goselin. His wife, the former Regina M. "Jean" Kuntz, whom he married Sept. 26, 1942, at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, Kankakee, died Jan. 20, 2000. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving during World War II, and a member of the Bradley American Legion Post 0766 and the VFW. He was a member of Maternity BVM Catholic Church, the Holy Name Society and the Knights of Columbus Council 745.

Surviving are two sons and daughters-in-law, Gene and Christy Goselin, of Frankfort, and Scott and Sue Goselin, of Bourbonnais; one daughter and son-in-law, Vicki and David Cale, of Elkhart, Iowa.; nine grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren; one sister and brother-in-law, Loretta and Arnold

LaFrance, of Kankakee; brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law, Geraldine and Francis McGregor, of Bonfield; Gerald Kuntz, of Kankakee; Josephine Kuntz, of Bradley; Joan Goselin, of Park Forest; Eula Goselin, of Aroma Park; Maxine Kuntz, of Bourbonnais; and Doris Kuntz, of Kankakee; and several nieces and nephews.
