Frank Bretveld -- St. Anne Frank Bretveld, 86, of St. Anne, died Wednesday (March 28, 2007) at Riverside Medical Center. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Friday at Clancy-Gernon-Houk Funeral Home in St. Anne, and from 10 a.m. Saturday at First Reformed Church of Wichert until the 11 a.m. funeral services. Rev. He was born March 8, 1921, in Sibley, Iowa, the son of Bernard and Fannie VanDyke Bretveld. He was a past member of the Kankakee County Board and a member of the Gladioli Growers Association. He was named Farmer of the Year in 1980. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1943-1945. He was a member of First Reformed Church of Wichert, where he was a Sunday school teacher for many years, catechism teacher, deacon, elder and served on the building committee. Surviving are his wife, the former Sadie Romein, whom he married Sept. 3, 1941, in Wichert; two sons and one daughter-in-law, Bennett Bretveld of Momence, Rodney and Julianne Bretveld of Bradley; one daughter and son-in-law, Cathy and Tim Tobey of Preston, Wash.; nine grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandson; one sister and brother-in-law, Harriet and Bob Roland of St. Charles; one brother and two sisters-in-law, Albert and Esther Bretveld of St. Anne, and Ruth Bretveld of Alsip. Deceased are three brothers, Henry, Dick and Bernard Bretveld; and one daughter-in-law, Sylvia Bretveld.
