Frank Mitchell -- Kankakee Frank J. Mitchell, 83, of Kankakee, died Saturday (Aug. 18, 2007) at his home. Visitation will be from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee with a 4 p.m. wake and 7 p.m. Marine Corps League service. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Martin of Tours Catholic Church in Kankakee. Rev. Dennis Settles will officiate. Entombment will be in Mt. Calvary Mausoleum. Memorials may be made to St. Martin of Tours Catholic Church, where he was a member; or to Hospice of Kankakee Valley. Mr. Mitchell was retired from A.O. Smith, after 37 years, and formerly worked at the Kankakee Clock Exchange. He was born July 30, 1924, in Kankakee, the son of Sam and Rose Cocchiario Mitchell. He served during World War II in the U.S. Marine Corps in the Pacific Theater and was a member of the VFW and the American Legion. He was a member of the Moose Lodge and enjoyed woodworking and repairing clocks. Surviving are his wife, the former Loretta Lawless, whom he married Oct. 14, 1950, at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Kankakee; four sons and two daughters-in-law, Michael Mitchell and David Mitchell, both of Bourbonnais, Gary and Rose Mitchell of Limestone, John and Mary Mitchell of Plainfield; three daughters and two sons-in-law, Diane and Larry Chouinard of Kankakee, Sheryl Kupferer of Montgomery, Lisa and Tom Zipsie of Bourbonnais; nine grandchildren, Mitchell Chouinard, Jeffrey Chouinard, Kati Mitchell, Adam Mitchell, Jennifer Kupferer, Kelly Kupferer, Brock Mitchell, Sydney and Gabrielle Mitchell; and one sister-in-law, Arlene Mitchell of
