Frederick Kenneth "Bud" Beyerlein, 101, of Kankakee, died Monday (Dec. 6, 2004) at the Miller Center. Private visitation and services will be held. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens. Memorials may be made to Hospice of Kankakee Valley. Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, West Kankakee, is in charge of arrangements. Mr. Beyerlein had owned and operated the Momence Grist Mill during the 1930's and into the 1940's. He founded and operated Nu-Art Sign Co. with his wife starting in the early 1940's for over 50 years. He had worked on a farm, as a projectionist at the Momence Theater, at Chicago Ford Motor Corporation, was a consultant with Pepperidge Farm for three years and had also worked for Mandel Brothers and Weather Seal Storm Windows. He was born June 26, 1903, in Momence, the son of Arthur and Mina Calkins Beyerlein. His wife, the former Glenola "Babe" Butler, whom he married July 8, 1928 at Mt. Carmel Catholic Church in Chicago, died June 20, 1994. Surviving are one son and daughter-in-law, James and Carolyn Beyerlein of Kankakee; two grandsons, Jeffery Beyerlein of Kankakee, Michael A. (Rachell) Beyerlein of Lansing, Mich.; and two great-granddaughters, Madison and Macy Beyerlein. One sister is deceased. Mr. Beyerlein was a member of the Kankakee Elks and the Moose. He started the River RAT Club in Aroma Park. He enjoyed golfing and fishing in Canada and the Kankakee River.
