February 11, 1946 - February 6, 2005

Gene David Rieder, 58, of Bourbonnais, died Sunday (Feb. 6, 2005) at his home. He was a lung transplant recipient at Loyola Medical Center in 2001. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais, and from 10 a.m. Wednesday at the Manteno Church of the Nazarene, until the 11 a.m. services. Rev. Jack McCormack will officiate. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens. Memorials may be made to the Nazarene World Missions or to the Good News Club. Mr. Rieder was a chemical technician at Lyondel Equistar of Morris. He was born Feb. 11, 1946, in Hillsdale, Mich., the son of Rev. David L. and Lillian L. Ellis Rieder. His father is deceased. Surviving are his wife, the former Rachel Kinnersley, of Bourbonnais, whom he married Aug. 2, 1971, at the First Baptist Church in Momence; two sons and daughters-in-law, Nathan and Megan Rieder of Bourbonnais, Aaron and Kristen Rieder of Kankakee; his mother, Lillian Rieder Fitts of Bourbonnais; one sister and brother-in-law, Roseann and Jerry Klose of Hemet, Calif.; one brother and sister-in-law, Duane and Yvonne Rieder of St. Anne; mother-in-law, Ruth Kinnersley of Bradley; brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law, Roberta and Marvin Schoenwetter of Waterloo, Wis., Reva and Dave Schoenwetter of Knoxville, Ill., Ron and Eva Kinnersley of Coalinga, Calif., Roger and Cheryl Kinnersley of Sylvania, Ohio, Randy and Ruth Kinnersley of Nashville, Tenn., Doug and Renee Kindle of Kewanee, Rick and Merilee Kinnersley of Kankakee; and special friends, MaryLou and Gary Carney of Chesterton, Ind.
