George Edwards Jr. -- Bourbonnais Visitation for George P. Edwards Jr., 84, of Bourbonnais, will be from 9:30 a.m. Saturday until the 10:30 a.m. memorial service at Central Christian Church, where he was a member. Inurnment will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens, Aroma Township. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to Central Christian Church. He died Sunday (Nov. 5, 2006) in the emergency room at Provena St. Mary's Hospital, Kankakee. Mr. Edwards was a retired electrician. He owned Edwards Star Market Grocery Store in St. Anne for 13 years; worked for Potter Electric for 10 years; and was general superintendent for Hi-Way Electric for 14 years. He retired from IBEW Local 176, Joliet, in 1983. He was born Nov. 15, 1921, in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Canada, the son of George Sr. and Minnie Rockert Edwards. His wife, the former Gertrude Parent, whom he married July 29, 1941, in Kankakee, died Jan. 1, 2006. He served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II. He coached Kankakee Lions Little League for 10 years. He enjoyed golfing, playing cards, and all sports, plus attending his sons,' grandsons,' and great-grandchildren's games. Surviving are five sons and four daughters-in-law, George III "Duke" and Barbara Edwards of Bourbonnais, Donald and Sharon Edwards of Manteno, David and Kim Edwards of Aberdeen, Wash., Dean and Marla Edwards of Kankakee, and Daniel Edwards of Joliet; one daughter and son-in-law, Patricia and William Rutherford of Des Moines, Iowa; 12 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren; and one brother and sister-in-law, Edward and Eve Edwards of New

Jersey. His parents are deceased. "I feel the most enjoyable years of my life were working for Potter Electric, managing a team in the Lions Little League and having the Edwards Star Market Grocery Store in St. Anne. The most important part of my life was my wife and children and family."
