June 16, 1918 - January 17, 2008

Visitation for Harold L. He was a medic in the U.S. Army during the Battle of the Bulge. He earned the European-African-Middle Eastern Theater Ribbon with one silver battle star, one service stripe, three overseas service bars and the Good Conduct Medal. He was also a Mason. Surviving are his wife, the former Beverly Deal, whom he married Dec. 15, 1945, in Chicago; two daughters, Karen Kolenda of Crete, Mary Helen Barker of Orland Hills; four granddaughters, Cari (Brian) DeProsperis of Cedar Lake, Ind., Kelly (Brian) Leigh of Lowell, Ind., Jennifer (Ryan) Vicary of North Aurora, Patricia Barker of Orland Hills; five great-grandchildren, Kathryn, Jacob, Niko, Jax, Giavanna; and nieces and nephews. Deceased are his parents, one brother and three sisters.
