Harry J. Jeck, 95, of Bradley, passed away Wednesday (Aug. 26, 2015) at Riverside Medical Center in Kankakee.

He was born Aug. 7, 1920, the son of Fred and Louise Gunschrick Jeck. Harry married Raena DeLude on Oct. 16, 1945, in Louisville, Ky. She preceded him in death on April 13, 2008.

Harry retired from ComEd in 1982, where he was a union member and former union president. He had served our country in the U.S. Army, first set of paratroopers, 82nd Airborne, earned bronze and silver stars, was a lifetime member of Kankakee American Legion, and was a member of St. Paul Lutheran Church. His hobbies included golf, bowling and softball.

Surviving are his son, Jim and Angela Jeck, of Bonfield; daughter, Jan and Gail Walling, of Bradley; sister-in-law, Della Jeck, of Bradley; brother-in-law, Richard DeLude, of Plymouth, Ind.; seven grandchildren; and 11 great-grandchildren.
