Harry R. Vimpeny, 91, of St. Anne, died Monday (May 10, 2010) at his home. Visitation will be from 12:30 p.m. Wednesday until the 1:30 p.m. funeral service at Aroma Park United Methodist Church. The Rev. Jim Williams will officiate. Burial will be in Kankakee Memorial Gardens, Aroma Township. Memorials may be made to Aroma Park United Methodist Church, where he was a member. 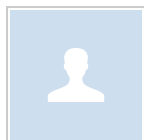

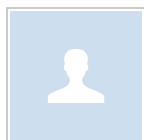
