Homer Roy -- Carbondale Homer Roy, 90, of Carbondale, and former area resident, passed away at 12:30 a.m. Aug. 16, 2008, at his home, surrounded by his family. A memorial Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 20 at St. Joseph Catholic Church, Bradley. Mr. Roy's body was donated to the Southern Illinois University School of Medicine as he had arranged. Memorials may be given to Hospice of Southern Illinois in Marion. Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home, Bourbonnais, will accept the donations, or they can be mailed directly to Hospice. Mr. Roy retired from Armour Pharmaceutical in 1980, where he worked in the power plant. Homer was born March 3, 1918, the son of Gerasime and Rosalie Hebert Roy. He held a chief engineer license with the Illinois Division of National Association of Power Engineers (NAPE). He was a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Bradley for many years, before moving to Carbondale six years ago. He was currently a member of St. Xavier's Church in Carbondale. Surviving are his wife, the former Lucille Provancal, whom he married Nov. 24, 1938, at Sts. Mary and Joseph Catholic Church, in Chebanse; daughter, Joyce Sippel and adopted daughter, Ann Ignas, both of Marion; granddaughter, Joy and Craig Graf of Kouts, Ind.; grandson, Thomas Sippel and Marilyn of Fort Wayne, Ind.; four great-grandchildren, Lexi, Alex, Andie and Addie, all of Kouts; sisters-in-law, Ruth Roy of Marion, "Honey" Provancal of Crestwood, Darlene Provancal of Midlothian; brother-in-law, Mose Dupuis of Bradley; and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents; brother, Paul J. Roy; and

sisters, Gertrude Dupuis, Bernette Theesfeld and Anna Marie Chouinard.
