Ima Gene Cote -- Peoria Visitation for Ima Gene Cote, 85, a resident of Peoria for two years and formerly a lifelong resident of Kankakee, will be from 2 p.m. Sunday until the 4 p.m. services at the Clancy-Gernon-Hertz Funeral Home, west Kankakee. She was a member of the First Baptist Church of Kankakee for over 50 years, where she was a deaconess, member of American Baptist Women's Group, in the Weneja Sunday school class, College Students and Servicemen Circle, and charter member of Home and Community Education. She was also a member of HEA and the Kankakee VFW Auxiliary. She volunteered serving meals at the state hospital and also delivered Meals on Wheels. She enjoyed bowling in the church league, playing cards and games, reading, sewing, crafts, and fishing. Surviving are one son, Randall Cote of Pekin, formerly of Kankakee; and one daughter, Jolene Cote and Dale Loudermilk of Peoria. One sister, Lucille Jones, is deceased.

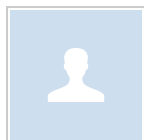
