While I was driving to a home for Thanksgiving dinner I received notice from Tom that Aunt lone had passed. I called Tom and Jane and found that while I was saying Mass Aunt lone was taken to God.

Aunt lone was the only person who called me Danny. The many visits to her home in St. Anne she always made me the most heavenly Angel Food cake in the world. In fact she taught me that you can toast Angel Food cake in the toaster. All you have to do is to tip the toaster on its side and very carefully slide it in and watch it with both eyes because it can easily burn. I always enjoyed my visits to her home because we would do alot of laughing. In the last few years I learned alot history of our family from her. I found it very interesting.

Last Saturday here in Dutch Harbor we had hurricane winds of 125mph where we lost some parts of the church roof. I remember waking up about 2am and saying out loud, "OK Aunt lone calm these winds". Well it took her until 7pm that night...many thanks.

Tom and Jane I want you to know that you had a great mother. She loved life and was gifted with the ability to make others laugh. This was probably her secret in living to the super age of 90.

She will be missed. However, we now have a person in heaven who can intercede for us. And so if we experience any strong winds in our lives just call on Aunt lone.
